What's on each Friday and Saturday at St. Georges?

Morning Prayer – Mondays, Tuesdays 7.45am; Thursdays, Fridays 9.00am; Saturdays 9.30am

A quiet, prayerful service, open to anyone, offering thanks for the new day and dedicating ourselves to God's service for the workday ahead. If you can't be there in person then perhaps use the free *Daily Prayer* app available from Google Play or Apple Store or *Common Worship: Daily Prayer*.



Church Open on Saturdays 10.00am to 12 Noon

The church is open every Saturday morning after morning prayer for anyone to drop in for whatever reason. You are likely to find Barry and the Churchwardens, people doing odd jobs and cleaning, some getting the church ready for Sunday worship like those arranging the flowers. There's usually a cup of coffee and biscuits available. It's also an opportunity to sit, listen or pray (see the flag). We try to fly the flag whenever the church is open to let anyone passing know that they are welcome to drop in. If you would like the church to be open more often, why not volunteer to 'church sit' and share that opportunity with others.



Evening Prayer – Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays & Fridays 5.00pm

An opportunity to reflect on the work of the day, giving thanks for people met and asking forgiveness for things done wrong or not done.
