All Souls' Memorial Service – Today at 4.00pm



We will be remembering by name all those who have died in the last year and had some connection with this parish, along with others who have died in years past whose relatives have made a special request.

This will be a quiet and reflective service where there will be an opportunity place flowers at the altar; to light a candle in memory of your loved one, if you wish, and a time to sit and pray quietly.

If you would like someone to be remembered by name, please **complete one of the sheets at the back of the Church** or speak to a churchwarden or member of clergy. It would be helpful if members of the congregation were able to support bereaved families by their presence at this service.

Poppies are on sale in the church today. What will you wear?



Red poppies as a symbol of remembrance were inspired by the 1915 poem 'In Flanders Fields' by John McCrae and are sold each year by the British Legion which works to ensure that the people of the United Kingdom remember all those who have lost their lives on active service to the Crown, and honours the service of the Armed Forces and veterans, and the contribution of their families – their beneficiary community.

White poppies are distributed by the Peace Pledge Union and are worn by thousands of people in the UK and beyond. White poppies have been worn in this way for over eighty years. There are three elements to the meaning of white poppies: they represent remembrance for all victims of war; a commitment to peace and a challenge to attempts to glamorise or celebrate war.



Any contributions of holly with berries would also be much appreciated by Pam Hooks for her Christmas decoration stall.




