
An order for the Holy Eucharist





Toddler Church

Age 0 - 3yrs

There is a wellresourced and carpeted area at the back of the church where adults with young babies or toddlers are welcome to go during the service if they feel they need a change of scene. This area has a speaker system so you are still able to be involved in the service.

Junior Church

Age 3yrs to Year 5

Junior Church meets in the Church Hall just before 10am where they have their own session including stories, prayers, craft activities, music, etc. They come into church during communion for a blessing and sit with the leaders for the remainder of the service. They have an opportunity to share with the congregation what they have been doing. YOUTH CHURCH Year 5/6 - Year 11

Youth Church starts in Church at 10.00am and then go to the Choir Vestry during the end of the first hymn. Here they have their own session with teaching, discussion, reflection, prayer, etc. They return to their families in time for communion.

All groups for children and youth are supported by at least 2 approved adults

The Season of Creation (or "Creationtide") started in the Orthodox Church in 1989 and has been supported by a growing number of

churches across Europe since then. It has the backing of all main Church groups, including the Church of England and the member churches of Churches Together in Britain and Ireland. The Season of Creation, stretches from 1 Sept to the feast of St Francis on 4 Oct.

The Gathering

We stand at the entry of the choir and clergy during which a hymn may be sung. (Hymn numbers are shown on the hymn boards and in the pew sheet.)

The Greeting

The president greets the people.

The Lord of all creation be with you **and also with you.**

(or)

Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you **and also with you.**



Words of welcome or introduction may be said.

Prayers of Penitence

The deacon invites all to confess their sins in these or similar words.

Deacon	We confess our sin, and the sins of our society,
	in the misuse of God's creation.

(or)

Let us confess our forgetfulness of the needs of the poor, and repent of the ways in which we waste the resources of the world.

(or)

Let us call to mind all that stains our lives and ask the Lord to wash away our guilt and cleanse us from our sins.

cf Psalm 51.2

(or)

Human sin disfigures the whole creation, which groans with eager longing for God's redemption. We confess our sin, and the sins of our society, in the misuse of God's creation.

cf Romans 8.22,23


(or)

Let us ask God to have mercy on our tired land, and to prosper the work of our soiled hands. Let us ask God to forgive our delusion of self-sufficiency, so that we may praise him for his provision and goodness.

(or)

God's whole creation groans. The land produces thorns and thistles and longs to be set free. Our sin affects all around us. We confess our sins in penitence and faith.


Kyrie Confession

Confession responses

Deacon God our Father, we are sorry for the times when we have used your gifts carelessly, and acted ungratefully. Hear our prayer, and in your mercy: forgive us and help us.

> We enjoy the fruits of the harvest, but sometimes forget that you have given them to us. Father, in your mercy:

forgive us and help us.

We belong to a people who are full and satisfied, but ignore the cry of the hungry. Father, in your mercy: **forgive us and help us.**

We are thoughtless, and do not care enough for the world you have made. Father, in your mercy: **forgive us and help us.** We store up goods for ourselves alone, as if there were no God and no heaven. Father, in your mercy: forgive us and help us.

The Absolution

The president pronounces absolution using these or similar words

Almighty God, who in Jesus Christ has given us a kingdom that cannot be destroyed, forgive you your sins, open your eyes to God's truth, strengthen you to do God's will and give you the joy of his kingdom, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Gloria in Excelsis

Glory in the highest to the God of heaven! Peace to all your people through the earth be given! Mighty God and Father, thanks and praise we bring, Singing hallelujah to our heavenly king.

Jesus Christ is risen, God the Father's Son! With the Holy Spirit, you are Lord alone! Lamb once killed for sinners, all our guilt to bear, Show us now your mercy, now receive our prayer.

Christ the world's true Saviour, high and holy One, Seated now and reigning from your Father's throne: Lord and God, we praise you! Highest heaven adores: In the Father's glory, all the praise be yours!

The Liturgy of the Word

The Collect

The president reads the appropriate prayer for the week. We sit to listen to the readings.

The Readings

At the end of each reading from Holy Scripture

Reader This is the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

A psalm may be read

We stand to hear the Gospel. A gradual hymn may be sung.

<u>Gospel</u>

We turn to face the Gospel party.

Gospeller Alleluia, alleluia.

God has spoken to us through his Son,through whom he created the worlds.cf Hebrews 1.2Alleluia.

Gospeller The Lord be with you and also with you.

Gospeller Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to ... **Glory to you, O Lord.**

At the end of the Gospel reading.

Gospeller This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.** We sit to listen to the sermon.

We stand to affirm the faith of the church. (This may be omitted on weekdays.)

The Creed

Deacon Let us affirm our faith in God the Creator, God the redeemer and God the sustainer.



Do you believe and trust in God the Father, source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist? **We believe and trust in him.**

Do you believe and trust in God the Son, who took our human nature, died for us and rose again? **We believe and trust in him.**

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in the world? **We believe and trust in him.**

This is the faith of the Church. This is our faith. We believe and trust in one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.

We sit or kneel to pray.

Prayers of Intercession

Let us pray to God the almighty, the King of creation.

We are invited to respond to each petition in these or other similar words.

Lord in your mercy (or) Lord, hear us
Hear our prayer
Lord, graciously hear us

At the end of the prayers we say ...

Merciful Father, accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

The Liturgy of the Sacrament

We stand as the president introduces the peace.

The Peace

Isaiah prophesied that at the coming of the Prince of Peace 'They will not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain;for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the Lord as the waters cover the sea.'

The peace of the Lord be always with you **and also with you.**

Deacon Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

We share a handshake with those around us saying 'Peace be with you.'

An Offertory Hymn may be sung.

Preparation of the Table

The bread and wine for communion and the collection are offered with these or similar words.

At the offering of bread

Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation. Through your goodness we have this bread to set before you, which earth has given and human hands have made. It will become for us the bread of life. **Blessed be God for ever.**

At the offering of wine

Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation. Through your goodness we have this wine to set before you, fruit of the vine and work of human hands. It will become for us the cup of salvation. **Blessed be God for ever.**

At the offering of money

Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation; Through your goodness we have this money to offer, the fruit of our labour and of the skills you have given us. Take us and our possessions to do your work in the world. **Blessed be God for ever.**



The Eucharistic Prayer

(Prayer A with proper preface 1)

The Lord be with you (or) and also with you.

The Lord is here. **His Spirit is with us.**

Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right, it is our duty and our joy, always and everywhere to give you thanks, holy Father, almighty and eternal God. For you have created the heavens and the earth, and formed us in your own image. In the fullness of time you sent forth your Son, your eternal Word, who laid down his life for our salvation and rose from the grave, the first-fruits of your new creation. You send forth your holy and life-giving Spirit to give life to our mortal bodies and to renew the face of the earth. Therefore with all the heavenly hosts, we give voice to everything that you have made, and sing the eternal hymn of praise:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest

The Eucharistic Prayer

(Prayer A with proper preface 2)

The Lord be with you (or) and also with you.

The Lord is here. **His Spirit is with us.**

Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right and good to give you thanks and praise, almighty God and Father, through Jesus Christ your Son. Through him you have created us in your own image, and made us stewards of your good creation. Through him you teach us to exult in the birds of the air, the lilies of the field. the precious and life-giving crops of the earth. Through him you free us from the slavery of sin, giving him to die upon the cross and to rise again for our salvation. Through him, you begin your work of new creation, as we look for a new heaven and a new earth in which your righteousness dwells. Therefore, we join with angels and archangels, and give voice to every creature under heaven, for ever praising you and saying:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest Accept our praises, heavenly Father, through your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ, and as we follow his example and obey his command, grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit these gifts of bread and wine may be to us his body and his blood;

who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.


Therefore, heavenly Father, we remember his offering of himself made once for all upon the cross; we proclaim his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; we look for the coming of your kingdom, and with this bread and this cup we make the memorial of Christ your Son our Lord.

Deacon Jesus Christ is Lord:

Lord, by your cross and resurrection you have set us free. You are the Saviour of the world.

Accept through him, our great high priest, this our sacrifice of thanks and praise, and as we eat and drink these holy gifts in the presence of your divine majesty, renew us by your Spirit, inspire us with your love and unite us in the body of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Through him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, Father almighty, in songs of everlasting praise: **Blessing and honour and glory and power be yours for ever and ever. Amen.**



The Eucharistic Prayer

(Prayer G)

The Lord be with you (or) T and also with you.

The Lord is here. **His Spirit is with us.**

Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **It is right to give thanks and praise.** Blessed are you, Lord God, our light and our salvation; to you be glory and praise for ever.

From the beginning you have created all things and all your works echo the silent music of your praise. In the fullness of time you made us in your image, the crown of all creation.

You give us breath and speech, that with angels and archangels and all the powers of heaven we may find a voice to sing your praise:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

How wonderful the work of your hands, O Lord. As a mother tenderly gathers her children, you embraced a people as your own. When they turned away and rebelled your love remained steadfast. From them you raised up Jesus our Saviour, born of Mary, to be the living bread, in whom all our hungers are satisfied.

He offered his life for sinners, and with a love stronger than death he opened wide his arms on the cross.

On the night before he died, he came to supper with his friends and, taking bread, he gave you thanks. He broke it and gave it to them, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine, he gave you thanks, and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Deacon Jesus Christ is Lord:

Lord, by your cross and resurrection you have set us free. You are the Saviour of the world.

Father, we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross; we remember his dying and rising in glory, and we rejoice that he intercedes for us at your right hand. Pour out your Holy Spirit as we bring before you these gifts of your creation; may they be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

As we eat and drink these holy things in your presence, form us in the likeness of Christ, and build us into a living temple to your glory. Remember, Lord, your Church in every land. Reveal her unity, guard her faith, and preserve her in peace.

Bring us at the last with our Lady Mary, the God Bearer, St George, [N] and all the saints to the vision of that eternal splendour for which you have created us; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, by whom, with whom, and in whom, with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, Father almighty, in songs of everlasting praise:

Blessing and honour and glory and power be yours for ever and ever. Amen!

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Breaking of the Bread



We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

The Post-Communion Prayer

Lord of all Creation, as we have received the bread and wine, fruits of the earth and tokens of salvation, so with joy we celebrate your goodness a nd commit ourselves to serve you on your earth, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

When Junior Church meet, the children are invited to give feedback after which this prayer may be said by all.

Lord Jesus, we thank you for the children and young people of this parish family. Bless and guide all those who encourage them on their journey of faith, today and always. Amen

The notices and any banns of marriage are read.



We stand as the president blesses the people using these or similar words.

God the Holy Spirit, whose breath fills the whole creation, help you to bear his fruits of love, joy and peace **Amen.**

and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be among you and remain with you always. **Amen.** Deacon Tend the earth, care for God's good creation, and bring forth the fruits of righteousness.Go in the peace of Christ.Thanks be to God.
