

Opening Prayer

**Faithful one, whose word is life:
Come with saving power to free our praise,
Inspire our prayer and shape our lives
For the Kingdom of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen**

Let us come before God together as members of the same family-
parts of the body of Christ, loved and accepted by Jesus.

**Thank you, Jesus, for uniting us with the Father
so we can all be children of God.
Thank you that we are adopted into Your family by grace
and have a place where we belong and are eternally loved. Amen.**

We ask for God's forgiveness

The deacon says:

The sun of righteousness has dawned with healing in his wings.
Let us come to the risen Christ, confessing our sins in penitence and faith.

Silence for Reflection

Like Mary at the empty tomb,
we fail to grasp the wonder of your presence.
Lord, have mercy. **Lord, have mercy.**

Like the disciples behind locked doors,
we are afraid to be seen as your followers.
Christ, have mercy. **Christ have mercy.**

Like Thomas in the upper room,

This or an alternative version on the separate sheet may be said or sung.

We worship you, almighty Father,
let our voices ring! Sing: *Gloria...*

Jesus, blessed Lamb of God,

Thanks be to God.



*We stand to hear the Gospel. We sing the **Gospel Hymn** during which we turn to face the gospel reader.*

Gospel

Gospeller The Lord be with you
and also with you.

Gospeller Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to ...
Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end of the Gospel reading.

Gospeller This is the Gospel of the Lord.
Praise to you, O Christ.

We sit to listen to a talk.

The Creed

Deacon Let us declare our faith in the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

**Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures;
he was buried;
he was raised to life on the third day
in accordance with the Scriptures;
afterwards he appeared to his followers, and to all the apostles:
this we have received, and this we believe. Amen.**

We sit or kneel to pray.

The Prayers of the People

As children of a loving God who always listens to our cries,
let us pray to our Father in heaven.

Response
God of love, **Hear our prayer.**

We come to be fed

We stand as the president introduces the peace with these or similar words.

The Peace

The risen Christ came and stood among his disciples and said,
'Peace be with you.'

Then were they glad when they saw the Lord. Alleluia.

(or)

The risen Lord now reigns at God's right hand.
He is the Prince of Peace.

The peace of the Lord be always with you
and also with you.

Deacon Let us offer one another a sign of peace.


We share a handshake with those around us saying 'Peace be with you'.

Preparation of the Table

The bread and wine for communion are brought to the altar.

Be present, be present,
Lord Jesus Christ,
our risen high priest;
make yourself known in the
breaking of bread.
Amen.



The Prayer of Thanksgiving

The Lord be with you.
And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.
We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
It is right to give our thanks and praise

It is right to praise you, Father, Lord of all creation;
in your love you made us for yourself.
When we turned away
you did not reject us,
but came to meet us in your Son.
**You embraced us as your children
and welcomed us to sit and eat with you.**

In Christ you shared our life
that we might live in him and he in us.
**He opened his arms of love upon the cross
and made for all the perfect sacrifice for sin.**

On the night he was betrayed,
at supper with his friends
he took bread, and gave you thanks;
he broke it and gave it to them, saying:
Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you;
do this in remembrance of me.
**Father, we do this in remembrance of him:
his body is the bread of life.**

At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine,
he gave you thanks, and said:
Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant,
which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins;
do this in remembrance of me.



**Father, we do this in remembrance of him:
his blood is shed for all.**

As we proclaim his death and celebrate his rising in glory,
send your Holy Spirit that this bread and this wine
may be to us the body and blood of your dear Son.
**As we eat and drink these holy gifts
make us one in Christ, our risen Lord.**

With your whole Church throughout the world
we offer you this sacrifice of praise
and lift our voice to join the eternal song of heaven:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.**

Giving of Communion

Take this bread, share this wine.
In these Christ comes to us
with love from God.

The gifts of God
for the people of God.
Amen. Alleluia!



All are welcome at the altar.

Please come forward to the altar rail as directed.

If you wish to receive the blessed bread please offer your cupped hands to receive it. Likewise, if you wish to receive the blessed wine please guide the cup and take a sip of wine.

If for any reason you feel unable to receive the blessed bread and wine, please do still come forward to receive a sign of God's blessing – simply bow your head and keep your hands lowered.

The Blessing


God the Father, by whose glory Christ was raised from the dead,
