EcoTip 2023 No: 68—Tackle the Oven

It's one of the most dreaded cleaning tasks, but scrubbing the oven doesn't have to be a chore. Try using a solution of equal parts salt and bicarbonate of soda and enough vinegar to make it froth into a spreadable paste., plus a squirt of lemon juice. Leave the paste on for a few hours, then remove the gunk from the corners with wire woo;, a sponge, and old toothbrush or a metal scraper—you'll be surprised at how effective such a benign cocktail of products can be!
